Liz Taylor, managing director of the Manchester based Taylor Lynn Corporation (TLC), has been a recognised as a 'Legend Of Industry' by Variety, the children's charity, for her services to events management over the last 26 years. Liz will receive her award at a black tie dinner on 1 November 2012 at the Hilton Deansgate Hotel in Manchester.
